THE WORD THIS WEEK

Noah's Flood is not in the Sunday Lectionary, but everyone knows the first part of this long story. For most people, though, the story ends when the waters recede, the sun comes out and the animals come out of the ark. What not everyone knows, is the next stage, the covenant made by God with humanity and symbolised by the rainbow. It's thought of as a comic story, a bit of a joke, but it is of immense significance. It is when Creation could well have been destroyed, but instead God purifies it and promises not to punish it by flood again. God in effect is promising to tolerate humanity in its sinfulness and violence. This is reassuring and the antidote to some hell-fire preaching, especially in Lent.
