

Parish Hall This was a major topic during the recent parish meeting. The net cost to the parish for the running the hall in 2023 was £4813, a very large portion of which was due to hiring costs such as cleaning etc. It was suggested that we look at the cost if we don't hire it out and keep the hall solely for parish use, this would reduce the cost significantly to around £1800 per year but would require a team of willing volunteers to operate the hall on a self-sufficient basis, plus fund-raise for the c£30k repairs that are required soon.

If successful in establishing this group, we could implement this change. Please let us know if you would like to help.
