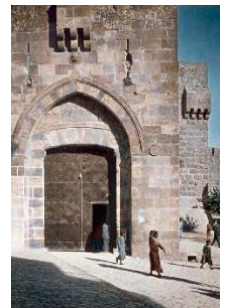

The Word this Week

In the story of the rich young man who comes to Jesus full of good intentions, there are some simple words that speak so clearly to our own age: when Jesus tells him to sell everything and give it to the poor, 'his face fell at these words, and he went away sad, for he was a man of great wealth.' How sad it is that such a keen and good young man could not free himself from the one thing that was holding him back, his dependence on money. Jesus' words 'How hard it is...' perhaps indicate his own sadness that the young man could not free himself from this. Jesus' teaching was new - as the disciples' reaction shows. In Israel at the time, riches were thought to be a blessing from God. But as Jesus knew and taught, holding on to anything that passes away can distract us from holding on to things that are eternal.

Saint of the Week **Blessed William Howard (1612-1680)**

Born in 1612, son of the Earl of Arundel, William married Mary, daughter of Lord Stafford. They were devoted parents who had 9 children, but they lived in the Low Countries for much of the period of the Civil War & Commonwealth due to the difficulties which faced Catholics in England. In 1678 he was accused with 4 other Catholic peers of being involved in the “Popish Plot”, a fabrication which triggered a widespread persecution of Catholics. At the age of 65, he was impeached on a charge of high treason. William acquitted himself well and the outcome was shown up as a miscarriage of justice. When the verdict of guilty was brought, William said: “I confess I am surprised at it... but God’s will be done and your Lordships; I will not murmur at it. God forgive those who have falsely sworn against me”. He was beheaded on Tower Hill on 29 December 1680 & beatified by Pope Pius XI in 1929.
