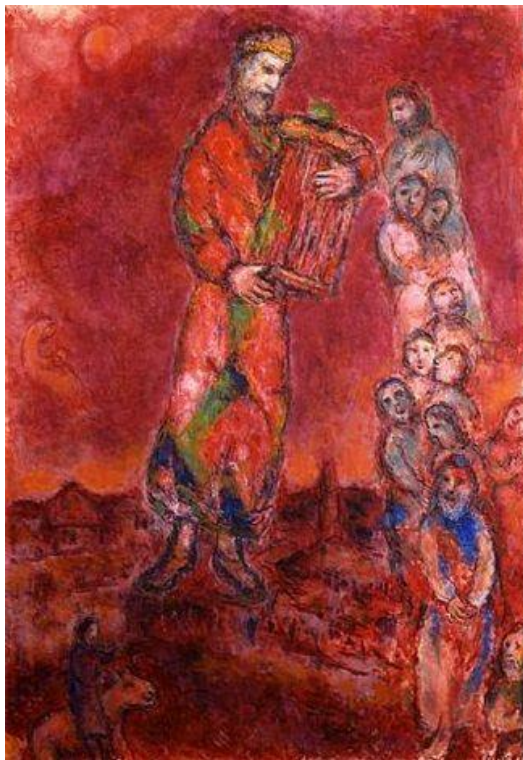

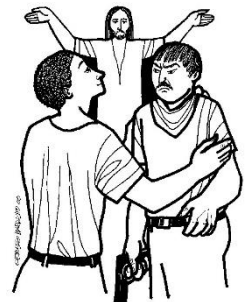

THE WORD THIS WEEK

This Sunday and the next have not been celebrated for many years because of the calendar, but today's readings parallel those of the 7th Sunday of Year A, and a comparison might be instructive. We hear the same messages - love your enemies; turn the other cheek; if someone takes your cloak, give them your tunic as well. But Luke's way of telling it is, like the Beatitudes last week, more compressed and with less elaboration. It is also, like last week, more radical and in one case more difficult: *do not ask for your property back from the man who robs you*, which comes just before Luke's version of the 'golden rule': *Treat others as you would like them to treat you*. The last verse, about the amount you will get back if you have given to others, is the sole exception to this general pattern of concision; all this detail is Luke's alone. One gets the impression that this is not so much a sermon to a crowd as an intimate talk to the disciples, and therefore to us as well. The first reading is a story we do not hear often. It vividly illustrates one of the most difficult sayings of Jesus: *Love your enemies*.
